Ο Ἀμερικανὸς κ. Λόου ἀνέλαβε τὴν περίθαλψιν τῶν προσφύγων μέχρι τῆς ἀναχωρήσεώς των.

ΡΑΙΔΕΣΤΟΣ, 18 Ὀκτωβρίου. (Τοῦ Ἑταιρικοῦ Τύπου).—Εἰκοσι καὶ ὀκτὼ χιλιάδες πανικοβλήτων προσφύγων συνεκεντρώθησαν ἐνταῦθα, κατεγόμεναι ὑπὸ τοῦ ἰδίου φόβου ὅφ' οὗ κατείχοντο πρὸ τριῶν ἑβδομάδων οἱ ἐν Σμύρῃ πρόσφυγες.

Ἡ Ραϊδεστὸς κατέστη τὸ κέντρον τῆς συγκεντρώσεως καὶ τῆς ἀναχωρήσεως τῶν προσφύγων.

Ἀπαντες οἱ πρόσφυγες πιστεύουν ὅτι οἱ Τούρκοι εὐρίσκονται καθ' ὁδόν, οὐδεμία δὲ διαβεβαίωσις εἶναι δυνατὴ νὰ τοὺς καθησυχάσῃ.

Οἱ πρόσφυγες πιστεύουν γενικῶς ὅτι οἱ Κεμαλισταὶ θὰ φθάσουν εἰς Θράκην μαζί με τὰ Βρετανικὰ στρατεύματα τῆς κατοχῆς, εἰς δ' ἑκαστος ἐξ αὐτῶν βιάζεται νὰ ἀπέλθῃ ὅσον τὸ δυνατόν ταχύτερον.

Χίλιοι χωρικοὶ ἀναχωρήσαντες προχθὲς διὰ νὰ ἐπιδιεασθοῦν σιδηροδρομικῆς ἀμφοστοιχίας ἤτις, ὥς ἐπίστευον οὗτοι, τοὺς ἀνέμενεν, ἐπείστρεψαν σήμερον ἐκ νέου ἐνταῦθα καταδρέκτοι ἐκ τῶν ραγδαίων βροχῶν καὶ ἀπέλπιδες.

Καὶ αὐτὰ εἰσέτι τὰ ἄρτοποιεῖα τῆς πόλεως ἐκλείσαν, ἡ κυβέρνησις δὲ ἐπαύσε παρέχουσα πρὸς τοὺς πρόσφυγας τὰ ἡμερήσια σιτηρέσια των. Τὴν διατροφήν τῶν προσφύγων ἀνέλαβεν ὁ Ἀμερικανὸς συνταγματάρχης κ. Λόου, ἀντιπρόσωπος τῆς ἐπιτροπῆς τῆς Περιθάλψεως, μέχρις ὅτου φθάσουν τὰ ὑπὸ τῶν Βρετανῶν ἀποσταλέντα τρόφιμα. Ὁ δὲ ἡμέτερος κ. Μαργαρίτης καὶ οἱ πλείστοι τῶν πολιτικῶν ὑπαλλήλων ἀπῆλθον τὴν προχθὲς Δευτέραν, τὴν διοίκησιν δὲ τῆς πόλεως ἀνέθεσαν εἰς τὸν κ. Λόου, μέχρις ὅτου φθάσουν αἱ Βρετανικαὶ στρατιωτικαὶ ἀρχαί.

Ἡ ὑπὸ τὸν κ. 28,000 Panic-Stricken Christians

Are Waiting for Ships at the

Thracian Port. N.Y.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 18 (Associated Press).—The Allied missions forbade the Kemalist gendarmeries destined for Thrace to enter Constantinople. The British navy has been ordered to stop all vessels bearing Turkish National police. The order produced keen disappointment among the exuberant Turkish population, which had made preparations on a vast scale to welcome the Kemalists on their march through the capital today.

However, a monster reception will be accorded General Rafet Pasha by Turks of all classes when he arrives here tomorrow from Mudania, to take up his new duties as Military Governor of Thrace.

Notwithstanding the decision of the Allied Commissioners to forbid the Kemalist gendarmerie to enter Constantinople, a contingent numbering about 200 arrived unexpectedly at the Stamboul waterside this evening from Ismid. Their ship anchored near the railway station, pending further action by the Allies.

Eventually the allied authorities announced that the gendarmerie would be allowed to land alongside the station, but must entrain immediately for Tchatalja. It is expected that they will leave early in the morning.

Ismid Neutral Zone is Delimited.

The boundary commission for the Ismid Peninsula, east of Constantinople, has completed its work satisfactorily, according to an official announcement made here this afternoon, and a formal agreement covering the new neutral zone has been signed.

RODOSTO, Oct. 18 (Associated Press).

The evacuation of the Greek army in the area assigned to the Italian battalion has been completed, and the Italians have been requested to take over further territory. The military evacuation of other districts is proceeding satisfactorily, but the problem of moving the large civilian population is becoming more serious daily. It is impossible thus far to get enough ships to take off the tens of thousands of refugees crowding every Thracian port.

Great serpentine columns of humanity, cattle and wagons block all the roads and overflow into the fields. Torrential rains multiply the misery of the exiles. Most of the Greek army is departing peacefully, but a considerable number of the Venizelist officers and men show a tendency to resist.

General Nider and his staff are assisting the Allies in every way and dissuading the advocates of war from aggression.

Practically all the Christians have left Adrianople for Karagatch. The Greeks seized all vehicles, cattle and farming implements belonging to the Turkish peasants.

A French battalion which arrived today at Adrianople began taking steps to protect the Moslem population against the Greeks, who threaten to burn Adrianople in revenge for the destruction of Smyrna. The Greek Government has requisitioned all stocks of wheat and grain, which it is transporting across the Maritza River for the needs of the population and refugees.

This town has become a jumping-off place in the Greek evacuation of Eastern Thrace. Twenty-eight thousand panic-stricken refugees are gathered here, all dominated by the same fear of the Turk that swayed the refugee crowds in Smyrna three weeks ago.

The whole town and all its extra population have abandoned any pretense of performing normal duties and have gathered along the gravel beaches waiting nervously for the ships which do not come.

A body of peasants with about 1,000 farm wagons left Monday for a railway station twenty miles to the north on a rumor that trains would await them there; but yesterday the long procession, bedraggled by the rain, returned, having been turned back by the military, who told them they must be evacuated by the sea.
