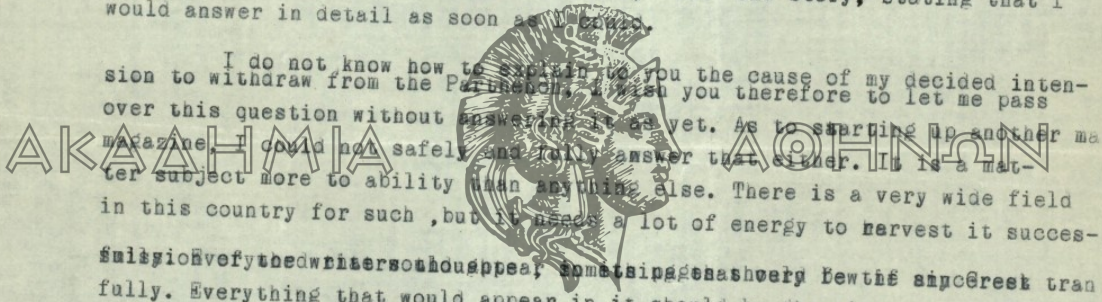

Of course , I am only aiming at a probability , for I have not yet made up my mind whether it would be the best thing for me to get into this k

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kind of business again and it all depends entirely on the way you are thinking to start the thing. I wish you would write me extensively about it, as you possibly can, and I will do my best to answer you in the same manner
